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



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#### Amendment:

Amendment to this MOU shall be made through written consent agreed upon by both the institutions at any time.

#### Non-Exclusivity:

The relationship between both the institutes under this MOU shall maintain the principle of non-exclusivity and hence both the institutes including their departments, centres, cells and subsidiaries are free to pursue other MOUs, agreements or collaborations of any kind with other parties.

#### Transfer of Responsibility:

Since this MOU is concluded on the basis of professional competence and expertise of both the institute, under no circumstances either party shall transfer or assign this agreement or right or obligations arising from the MOU, either wholly or in art to any third party.

#### Tenure and Termination:

This MOU will come in to effect from the date it is signed by the representatives of the two parties. It will remain valid for five years, and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and mutual agreement. Either institute may terminate the MOU by giving written notice to the other institute six months in advance. After termination, neither institute will be responsible for any lose, financial or otherwise, which the other institute may suffer. However, both the institute will ensure that all the activities in progress under this MOU are allowed to complete successfully.





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

# 2.1. Objectives of the Study

The process of Green Audit adopted in the college aims to promote environment management and conservation in and around the College Campus. The objectives of Green Audit are as follows:

- > To document the flora and fauna diversity of the college.
- To know about the environmental condition of the college, viz., air, water and soil.
- > To estimate the energy consumption of the college.
- > To monitor waste generation and management in the college campus.
- To ensure optimum utilization of resources to reduce carbon footprint.
- > To suggest measures for clean and green environment.

## 3. Methodology

#### 3.1. Onsite Visit

All the team members of Green Audit Committee of the college visited the places physically, inspected, instructed the concerned for improvement and safety measures were undertaken wherever necessary to minimize the impact on environment.

#### 3.2. Survey and Analysis

The Green Audit Committee arranged to send the water and soil samples to the authorized Laboratories/institutes for analysis.

#### 4. Water Quality Assessment and Management

Water is used in the college for various purposes like drinking, gardening, cleaning, washing clothes, utensils, preparing food, cleaning and maintaining toilets. The main source of water is ground water which needs to be filtered due to hard water quality. RO filters have been installed.

The water quality of Melamora College was tested by District Level Laboratory under Public Health Engineering Department (PHED), Golaghat Division, Golaghat, Assam. As per their report the physical and chemical quality of the water of college premises is within the permissible limit. Turbidity, PH and iron content found in the water of Melamora college were 4 NTU,6.9 and 0.34 ppm respectively. The process of water testing would be conducted even in future also. A Rain Water Harvesting plant has been set up in the college to conserve water. Leakage of water from RO's and taps was taken care of.








# 5. Soil Quality Management

It involves practices and treatments to protect soil and enhance its performance. In order to conserve and improve soil quality, plantation programmes are being conducted by the college on regular interval and most of the lands in the college are covered by grasses to avoid soil erosion. During gardening organic wastes are added in the soil to maintain soil quality. The use of plastic and paper is minimized within the college campus.



#### 6. Air Quality and Management

The college is situated in a rural area and free from any hazardous pollution but greenhouse gases are emitted by vehicles, air conditioners and refrigerators. To mitigate the situation many plants have been planted over the year in the college premises. The college campus is a 'No Smoking' area and the rooms of the college are well ventilated with ventilators .

#### 7. Waste Management

Solid waste generated in the process of different works can be channeled towards green use by recycling and reuse. These wastes are harmful for humans and animals and put threat to the health of all the stakeholders. Generation of bio degradable and non-bio degradable waste and its proper disposal is a challenge The college has been trying to make itself plastic free by creating awareness among students, teachers and other stakeholders. Waste in the form of newspaper, other paper records are stored in proper places and disposed off timely. Dustbins are maintained in the college premises to separate dry and liquid wastes. There are 11 dry dustbins and 1 wet dustbin.

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

#### 7.1 E- Waste Management

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
# 9. Electricity Consumption and Management

Energy is primary input requirement for operation of an organization and is consumed on a wide scale. The efficient use of energy and its sustainable use are of prime importance to sustain in the long run. Presently, the college uses electricity of 120KW for college generated by APDCL, Government of Assam. During power cuts the college relies on the generator.

To preserve energy, the college uses LED bulbs.

In order to reduce consumption of electricity, the college must install more solar panels and other source of renewable energy. Old tubes and bulbs must be replaced with new LED connections and the power supply to the college must be cut down after completion of classes to reduce unnecessary wastage of power. Replacement old electrical appliances, turning off electrical equipment's when not in use are simple ways to conserve energy.

The college is having 8 (Eight) Departments in Arts stream.


